## **GOALS AND PROGRESS**

Thanks to the support from our generous partners and donors, we installed a sewage system in the community in the summer of 2014. As of January of 2015, over 2/3 of the community was connected, with more being connected each day. Our next step with the sewage project is to install outhouses in the homes that do not have one, so that we may see 100% of the community connected to our system.

Following completion of our sewage project, we are looking to expand into other areas. The community identified the need for a park, which will replace a dark and dangerous dirt lot where youth frequently play. We are in the process of designing the park with the government, and are focusing our next steps on installing solar lighting. This lighting will provide safety while ensuring both economic and environmental sustainability.

### **HISTORY AND COMMUNITY**

Las Mercedes is a small and poor rural community in the southern part of Ecuador. community The houses 2,000 citizens in nearly around 350 houses. Most homes are made of brick or wood and lack basic necessities. Our project began in an attempt to help the community improve health outcomes and general well-being.

A local NGO, Dana Rasch, and his organization had built a health center, but the community still lacked basic things, specifically a sewage system. Sewage leaked onto the streets, and led to a high incidence of disease. Our project first aimed to address this issue and has since expanded into other areas, most recently energy.
